Look out for a flyer coming home with your child today.




HOME AND SCHOOL NEWS

This term our Kapa Haka performance rōpu is working towards two performances, the Tatarakihi Festival (Taranaki Primary Schools Kapa Haka Festival) and Puanga Mass performance. The group of students continuing on are learning the art of performing waiata-ā-ringa (action songs), haka, poi, mōteatea (chants) and discipline.

This follows on from Term 1's focus for the whole school to learn a range of waiata, then in Term 2 there was a choice for Year 3-6 students to continue to develop both waiata and haka at Kapa Haka time. During Terms 2 & 3 Matua John has been spending time in each of the Junior classes each week introducing and developing both waiata and reo for our Year 1 & 2 students.

We look forward to seeing the performance group prepare for, and take part in, the events coming up later in the term. They are certainly working hard and applying themselves.
